## USGS SAMPLES SMACKOVER PRODUCTION WATER IN MISSISSIPPI FOR LITHIUM

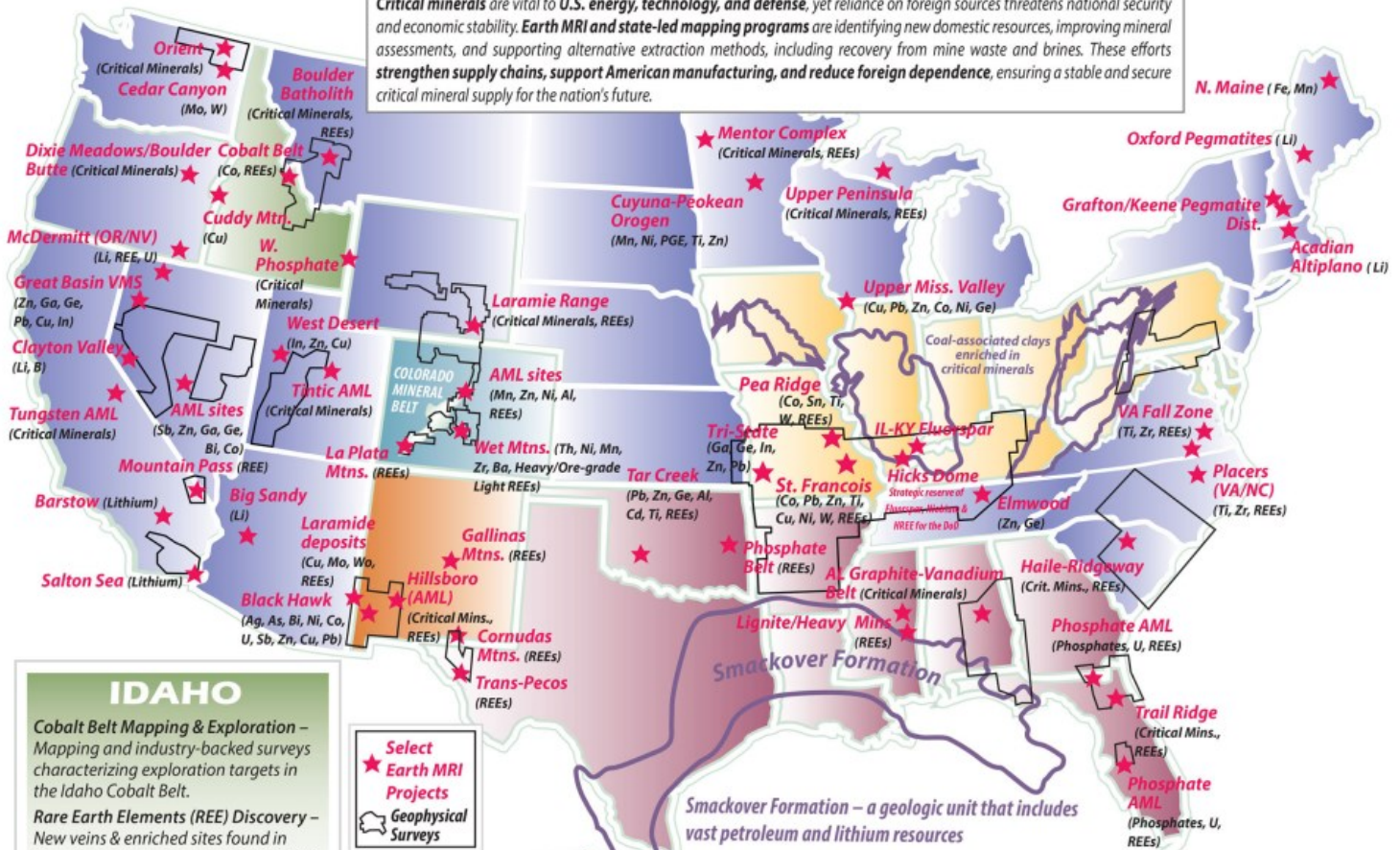
The Association of American State Geologist has prepared a Critical Minerals Project map for the lower 48 states to present to U.S. legislators during their fall liaison on Capitol Hill. The map in part is shown in Figure 1.

For Mississippi, this map shows the presence of Smackover Formation Brine Lithium and Lignite and Heavy Mineral Sands bearing Rare Earth Elements or REEs. Our own Tim Palmer has worked for private industry on lithium-bearing rhyolite intrusions in West Texas. According to Tim, the plan was to crush the rhyolite into small piles and then treat those piles with a strong acid to leach out the lithium. Then the lithium would be extracted from the leachate. A lot of mining would be involved in the process. In the Smackover of the Gulf Coast, the lithium-rich leachate can be taken directly from oil-production brines, thus excluding the cost of mining. That seemed to be a good business plan to Tim, who when he sees a rock, he sees money.

Tim Palmer discussed lithium sources in a paper on a regional study of subsurface brines he gave at the 2025 GCAGS Meeting at Stephen F. Austin in Nacogdoches, Texas, on April 11, 2025. After his talk, he was told that “he had moved the ball forward in understanding the source of the metal.” That’s when the USGS showed interest in sampling Smackover cores in MDEQ Office of Geology’s Core and Sample Library. Not only that, but they planed to sample Smackover production brines in the Gulf Coastal States. Figure 2 shows Tim Palmer and USGS staff sampling Smackover production water in Hiwannee Field in Wayne County on September 15, 2025.

The next day, the USGS team headed to Alabama to sample Smackover production brines in that state. The assessment in Figure 1 for the West South Central and Gulf Coast states: “Smackover Formation Brine Lithium Deposits – Arkansas holds – 19M tons of lithium, up to 136% of U.S. resource estimates.” So, we are looking forward to seeing the lithium potential in Mississippi.

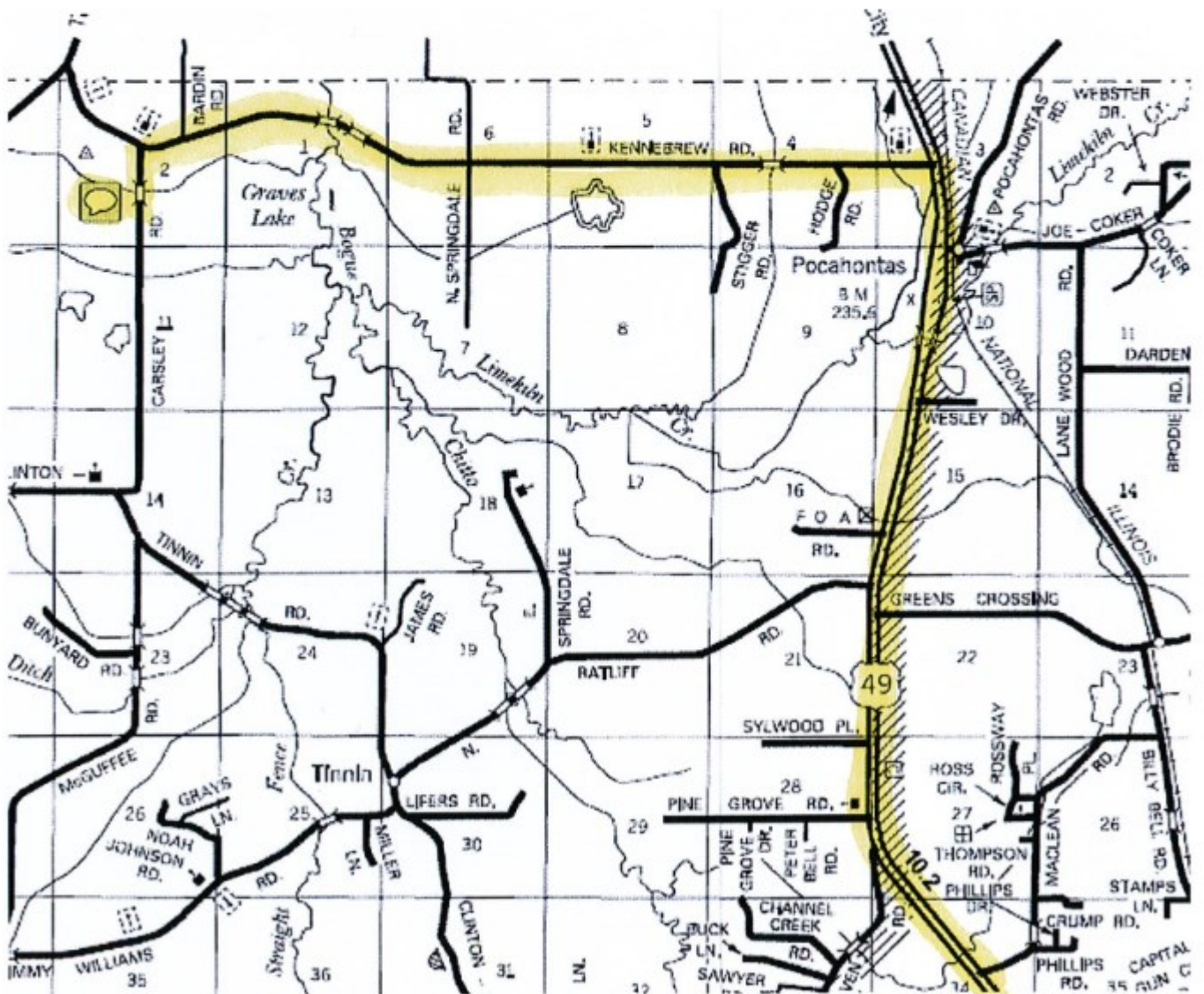
